Fun Facts

Independence Day, also called the Fourth of July or July 4th, is the United States' annual celebration of nationhood. It commemorates the passage of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776. Independence Day is celebrated on Sunday, July 4, 2021 in the United States.

A Few Safety Notes

Fireworks are synonymous with our celebration of Independence Day. Yet, the thrill of fireworks can also bring pain. Follow these safety tips when using fireworks:

- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- Avoid buying fireworks that are packaged in brown paper because this is often a sign that the fireworks were made for professional displays and that they could pose a danger to consumers.
- Always have an adult supervise firework activities. Parents don't realize that young children can suffer injuries from sparklers. Sparklers burn at temperatures of about 2,000 degrees - hot enough to melt some metals.
- Never place any part of your body directly over a firework device when lighting the fuse. Back up to a safe distance immediately after lighting fireworks.
- Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishaps.
- Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- Never carry fireworks in a pocket or shoot them off in metal or glass containers.
- After fireworks complete their burning, douse the spent device with plenty of water from a bucket or hose before discarding it to prevent a trash fire.
- Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.

Quick Cooks Recipe

Chocolate Chow Mein

Microwave 1/4 cup each peanut butter, chocolate chips and butter until melted. Put 3 cups each of Chow Mein noodles and Chex cereal, and 1/2 cup each of chopped peanuts and raisins in a resealable plastic bag; add the chocolate mixture and shake to coat. Add 2 cups confectioners' sugar and shake again.

Maintenance Corner

Disposal Tips

Always feed the disposal with water cold running and unit turned on. Do not stuff the disposal and then turn on. Always feed slowly. Do not feed the unit pastas or rice, starchy foods swell in water and will clog the pipes further down. Do not feed the unit stringy foods or vegetables like asparagus or artichokes. Glass, bottle caps, and silverware should not go in disposal. If they do, remove before using unit.
